Introduction

In September 2004 I caught a ferry to the island of Tenerife with the sole intention of completing my last two years of university in Marine Biology. While looking for a place to live I entered a small village on the south side of the island called El Médano. As I was heading down an avenue in direction of the sea, a sudden burst of wind with a strong smell of sea awoke my senses; deadened from a long journey. As I continued along, my senses were increasingly bombarded with the smells. I arrived to the end of the avenue where a pier prevented me from seeing the sea until, suddenly, I saw a colourful sail flying above the pier. Completely shocked, I ran up to the end of the pier where I could make out 5 more sails; jumping and surfing those enormous waves. They were playing in the middle of this hostile scene with complete security and challenging what most would fear, with complete serenity and certainty. They were in control of the situation. It was really spectacular.



I was so overwhelmed by the experience that I immediately told myself, "...I am going to live here and I'm going to learn how to that ...whatever it takes." At this point I should make a clarification: I have been sailing since I was 11 years old in a catamaran and the water, the wind and the waves have always been my passion. They are like my natural habitat. As a result, at 16 years of age I dedicated all my weekends and summer vacations to sailing. In the morning I was a sailing instructor and in the afternoons when the wind gets stronger I enjoyed

sailing on my own. I challenged myself more and more with each outing and it was a real treat to see how I reached my goals and how each day I sailed stronger and better. Following this first amazing encounter with the sea and those 5 colourful sails, I rented a small house in El Médano. I knew that those last two years were going to be a bit more than just studying. My life was a combination of studies and windsurfing. I went to the bay every morning at 6.30 which was about 70 kilometres from my home. A 6.00 in the evening I would get out of class and drive those 70 kilometres again hoping to catch a little wind and to sail the time the sun would allow me. Normally between 30 to 45 minutes. 140 kilometres every day to sail 45 minutes?! They were worth it. No doubt. Unfortunately, the winters of 2004 and 2005 went down as the ones with the least wind in the history of the Canary Islands. The wind almost never accompanied me and the best days always...



coincided with exams. However, above all I was able to reach the dream which was my reason for being there. I windsurf \on the learned In April of 2006 on a calm Saturday in El Médano (there was never any wind on the weekends!) I was on the internet looking at the weather when suddenly I come across a huge piece of news. "What? How? The twins are putting together a training camp! In El Médano!" I couldn't believe it. I sent them an e-mail and signed up immediately. It was a unique opportunity which I couldn't pass up. Daida and Iballa, my idols that I had read about so much in the magazines, were going to teach me to sail better! A total dream. That's what happened. I had the best week of my life in their camp. was surrounded by 38 girls full of energy, friendly and lots of good times. I learned a lot that week. I improved my Vulcanos, I pulled off my first Forward with Daida and Iballa screaming behind me. They awarded me with a new wave board for which I am totally grateful.

Above all, I discovered something that would change the focus of my life completely. I wanted to dedicate myself to windsurfing professionally. I realized that there was nothing I wanted more than that. It seemed like a good beginning. That is how the fun turned into passion and the passion into an ambition. I wanted to give myself the opportunity to try. It didn't matter how much it could cost me nor did the difficulties that would come my way scare me. Challenges don't scare me. To the contrary, they stimulate me. I had decided that it was my dream and that I would begin working for it. That same night I took some time to reflect. I studied all the possibilities and made my plans. I only had 2 months left of school of which I would certainly take advantage of by completing my program and getting my degree and then WOULD BE FREE!! 1 June 2006 I finished my degree. Now I was a Biologist and I went to work as an instructor in a sailing school as I had done the 6 previous summers. With the exception that this summer would be intense. 3 months of 10 hour days Monday to Sunday giving the maximum number of classes possible in order to save as much money as possible. The money would allow me to complete

my objectives and the training calendar I had set up for myself.

Two years later...

I have dedicated the last two year travelling to the best spots in the world looking for the perfect conditions to train. Brazil, the Caribbean, the Canary Islands and Greece have been some of the spots I have spent long periods of time training with an average of 5 to 7 hours a day.

This effort has helped me become one of the best female windsurfers in the world. I am now considered one of the top 5 freestylers. I have developed my own style, fluid and aggressive. I am appearing more and more in magazines and international press and am taking on new goals and projects such as windsurf films, photo shoots, videos and interviews.

I am currently running my own windsurfing center with my partner and associate. Our center is located in a beautiful and privileged bay of the Costa Blanca, Spain. This is a thrilling job! Creating new windsurfers, sharing what I feel about the sport and ensuring that it is seen as a way of life is extremely gratifying and fulfilling. The best part of this profession is being able to combine my trips, training sessions, competitions and photos shoots.. It's fantastic!!!

General Objectives 2008

This past December I had the privilege of participating in the latest movie by Peter Film, Club Ventos Beach Search. During the filming we covered the entire northeast coast of Brasil searching for the best waves in the company of 11 of best windsurfers in the world, 3 of them being world champions. In every moment we were accompanied by reporters from the most important magazines in the industry, buggys, helicopters and everything else one could imagine. It was just like a Hollywood film! On an international level, the success of this film is incredible.

I was fortunate to develop strong relationships with reporters from the most important magazines in the industry such as Windmag (France), Windsurf (USA), Board (UK), Windsurf Journal (GR), Surf a Vela (Spain). I do, however, intend to get published in the greatest number of publications possible both within the industry and outside of it...fashion, current news etc.

During the summer season (15 June to 30 August) while I run my windsurf center it is my intention to publish the material I will have gathered during the previous eight months.
